UP TO \$100,000 REWARD

Up to \$100,000 is being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the 1970 murder of St. Paul Police Officer James Sackett.

On May 22, 1970, St. Paul police officer James Sackett, 27, was shot by a sniper while responding to a fake maternity call for help at a home in the 800 block of Hague Avenue, near Selby Avenue and Victoria Street in St. Paul. Investigators believe that Sackett, who had served on the force for just 18 months, was not specifically targeted. Sackett was married and the father of four children, the youngest just three weeks old when he was killed. The evening he was shot was his first shift since the birth of his youngest child.

His death is the only unsolved police killing in the city.

Please bring closure to the family and friends of James Sackett, and bring his killer(s) to justice.
